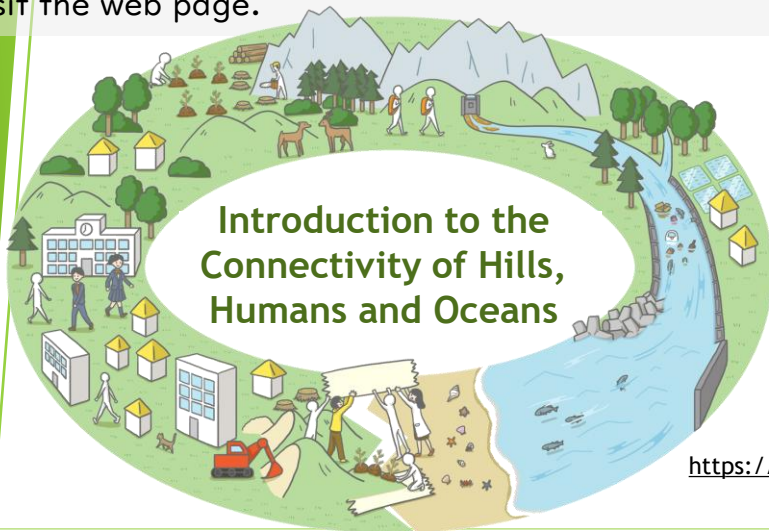


The Field Science Education and Research Center (FSERC), Kyoto University
